Board Briefs June 9, 2015

West Side sewer/foot bridge- A members Forum on the foot bridge for the sewer pipe brought questions and opinions from residents that were for and against the bridge.

Dam certification was filed. York Co. is paying for the Certification. This certifies that the dam and spill way meets standards. A motion was made and passed to contact Brenda Pogge about getting DCR to respond about certification.

The signed engagement letter and all the 2014 financial files are now at the accountants and our review should start soon.

Website Committee has been busy correcting errors and other idiosyncrasies found on the new website as well as responding to questions about the website from association members.

Two meetings have been held at the clubhouse, May 20 and June 3, to answer questions about the West Side Sewer/Pedestrian Bridge. Walt Zaremba, Brian Woodward and Kevin Campbell were in attendance. They had pictures of what the bridge will look like, answered questions about why the bridge is needed and why other suggestions would not work. The June 3rd meeting ended with Brian Woodward and Walt Zaremba stating they would look at the cost of an alternative solution i.e. another pump station on the West Side.

Aqua's 2015 plan includes replacing pipes in portions of Dennis Drive and Willoughby and for 2016 Holcomb and Dennis Drive. Boats will be checked Saturday June 13th to make sure they have 2015 decals and unkept boats will be auctioned.


LAKE MANAGEMENT - Queens Lake was surveyed and mapped by Clarke Aqua Management on May 20th. Clarke is finalizing a quote for a multiyear treatment program. **Pool Repairs:** The remaining perimeter caulking work was completed and both pools started before opening weekend. Adult pool is holding water well and chemical usage has been reduced. **Tennis court** is currently under renovation.

Board Briefs Special Meeting June 16, 2015 On Foot Bridge/Sewer Project


A special meeting for members to discuss and give their concerns on the foot bridge crossing the Lake. Members voiced their concerns about the bridge/sewer pipe over the lake to the west side. Concerns about the dam; if it will hold up to pile driving, will the railing height be safe, will York County take responsibility for the dam, and others said the bridge will be an eyesore. Others want sewer to the west side, think the foot bridge can be attractive, and the bridge will be safer than the dam road. York County will give us their decision soon.



BOARD OF DIRECTORS VACANCIES for 2016

These written nominations must be signed by three Shareholders in good standing, include a written statement on the part of the nominee expressing willingness to run for election, and be received in the office by October 4th in order to be included on the ballot.

The nominee must be a QLCA Member in good standing; that is, he or she is a Shareholder or an adult resident of a Queens Lake Property occupied by a Shareholder, and have all required dues and fees paid.

Directors are elected for a term of two years, are expected to uphold the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Association, attend evening Board Meetings, and oversee at least one of the Association's Standing Committees.



Beautification Information

Over the past several years, many of you may have lost your dogwoods to disease or drought. Fortunately there are cultivars recommended by the Virginia Cooperative Extension that prove disease resistant and will thrive in our area. Consider planting a flowering dogwood this Fall to add Spring color to your yard and the Queens Lake Community. The Extension's Becky Wells told us that the cultivars mentioned on their site are all equally rated and should do well in our neighborhood. They are: 'Appalachian Spring' resistant to *Discula* 'Cherokee Princess' broad-spreading large plant with large white bracts (5 inch diameter); highly rated

'Cloud 9' slow-growing plant with heavy white bract production; highly rated

var. *rubra* Cherokee Sunset[™] deep pink bracts and yellow-margined leaves.

It is encouraging to see that fishing and boating activity at the Marina has increased recently and slip rental inquiries and actual rentals continue to rise slowly though we are well behind previous years activity. Revenue from slip rentals is currently about \$2,000 below budget for the year and the Marina Committee will adjust our expenditures to adjust for the shortfall. Ramp rentals are tracking at budget for the year and we continue to have new inquires for ramp access as well.

The budgeted work to correct the drainage problems at the Marina entrance road has been completed and several recent heavy rain events have shown the fixes

were successful. The parking area at the Clubhouse steps was also re-graded to provide two additional parking slots for Clubhouse patrons.

The young ospreys in the nest at the Marina gas dock have learned their flying lessons well and are leaving the nest on a daily basis to look for food. They will soon be leaving the nest for good and wish them well.

We continue to invite all QLCA members to visit the Marina and enjoy our facility. 

BOAT ACCESS AREAS Aluminum dock ladders will be installed on the docks at the Princess Pond, West Queens and Holcomb access areas. These new ladders will make it easier and safer to get into and out of boats and kayaks.

LAKE MANAGEMENT Clarke Aqua Management will start monitoring Queens Lake on September 1st. Their monthly services will include water testing, aerator maintenance and lake evaluation. The number of monthly visits will be reduced to 7 or 8 from 12, skipping the winter months when there are little changes in the lake.Clarke is proposing to treat Queens Lake for Curlyleaf pond weed this coming December. The new crop of Curlyleaf will be sprouting soon and will continue to grow throughout the fall as the lake water cools. By December all new growth will be established but will remain far below the surface of the water. Doing a treatment in December will kill the Curlyleaf before it ever reaches the surface. This will break the reproduction cycle by eliminating the pond weed before it produces turions. A winter treatment will help the water quality of Queens Lake by reducing the amount of biomass that is added to the lake when the Curlyleaf senescences in May/June and turns the water cloudy and green.

EROSION ISSUES The committee has started to document major erosion problems at the head of Queens Lake with pictures and GPS coordinates on water shed maps so we can be prepared to protect Queens Lake from further infill. Phase III of the I-64 widening project (RT199 to RT199) will be in the design stage soon and the committee has contacted VDOT and will report any information we gather as it becomes available. **Committee members**: Rick Toth, Richard McCluney, Bruce Keener, Ralph Wilson, Craig Marcusion
