Hello Queens Lake,

Aqua will also begin replacing more than one mile of water main on Dennis Drive, Old Glory Court and Holcomb Drive. This project should take 8 to 12 weeks to complete.

Earlier this year, the Communication Committee worked with the Pool Committee and the Treasurer to take credit card payment for pool dues. Thank you to Bryan Edmonds, Claudia Smith and Lana Olson who worked on this trial program.

We look forward to seeing these new members at some of the coming events like The Halloween Party with Trunk or Treat, The Seafood Festival, The Arts and Craft Show, Christmas Brunch and a holiday Cookie Exchange. Board Briefs May 10, 2016

There was a meeting with York County representatives about the progress of the West side sewer lines. York County held a pre-construction meeting for the west side sewer project May 6. Representatives from VDOT, J. Sanders (primary contractor), Aqua, Queens Lake and county staff were present. J. Sanders is in the preliminary planning stages of the project. While no schedule has been made, they intend to begin work on the side streets before moving on to West Queens. Clearing land near the east side of the dam began this week. This will provide lake access for the construction of the bridge. The contractor doesn't expect to begin bridge work until late August or early September so the dam should be open to traffic most of the summer. We can expect a few, brief closures this summer as they drive six test pilings and a complete closure when they begin work on the bridge.

The contract has been signed for Design Management Assoc. to start the Capital Reserve study.

Mulching was done and flowers planted around the signs, and weeding and pick up of limbs.

Board members to take on an event for QL Day.

Pool members were allowed to charge through Square as a trial run to see how it would work for dues.

Working for a pass through to the parkway. Keeping up with I-64 expansion, footbridge, sewer project, and storm water runoff and noise mitigation.

Erosion issues on dam at the guardrail near the spillway will be repaired by VDOT. VDOT will remove the dying tree at the dam. Committee members will be meeting with representatives of VA Power and Colonial Soil Conservation District for a presentation and a walking tour of the upper end of Princess Pond and Queens Lake. Both groups offer assistance and grants for environmental issues that we face and can help guide us when working with the county and state to resolve erosion issues.

Marina Committee will be researching silt, repair plumbing and electrical issues. Security cameras have been installed.

New kiosk – Adjustments were made to the design and placement of a new kiosk. Meeting with contractors this week to discuss plans.

Motion was made and approved to change wording on the pool party form and Swim Test form.

FINANCE.

The finance committee had a meeting on June 29 with the primary discussion focused on the Capital Reserve Study. The review process has begun and a follow-up meeting with DMA will take place next month.

Board Briefs June 14, 2016

All of the 2015 financial files were delivered to the accountant's office last month and hopefully they have started the review process.

Representatives from DMA spent a lot of time measuring and taking photos of all the facilities.

Pool and Swim Team had sign-ups. Swim Team VPSU used Pay Pal and Pool members could charge this year through QL with Square, as a trial.

Phan will cut brush behind the clubhouse and pool in mid July. **Red's Tree Service** removed the nine Photinia Red Tops lining the fence behind the clubhouse. They died very quickly from a leaf spot fungus.

The trial run to test the ability of the website to accept and process credit card payments was for pool members. \$7,7000 was collected by Square and the collections fees of \$217 were charged against the Communication account.

On June 8th remapped Queens Lake confirming little to no Curlyleaf pondweed. We did discover some native plants species beginning to re-establishing which provide cover for small fish and are a food source for both fish and ducks. The lake will be mapped again in October after the new weed crop sprouts so a treatment plan for 2017 can be formulated.

Lake committee will resume Holcomb new path in July.

On May 18th members of the Lake Committee met with Tim
Beale, Distribution Forestry Coordinator for Dominion Power and
Jim Wallace, District Manager of the Colonial Soil and Water
Conservation District. Pond silting is being addressed.

Membership working on letters going to members who have not
paid dues yet.

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






Beautification

It's been a busy summer keeping QLCA common areas cut and maintained. Unfortunately, the beautiful, mature Photinia "Red-Tips" that lined the pool fence died very quickly from a leaf spot fungus and were removed. Many thanks to Lynn Maltinsky for grinding the stumps. Phan's Lawn Care has cut back growth on slope behind the pool and clubhouse and along the sides of the dam. York County reminds West-Side residents that yard debris piles must be removed if they interfere with the sewer project.

ENGLISH IVY-FRIEND OR FOE?

English Ivy can be a landscaper's best friend, filling large spaces with groundcover. But, it can also be an aggressive invader, killing trees and other native plants and damaging homes and fences. Here in Queens Lake, some trees are unrecognizable, as the vine can climb 90', smothering the tree and blocking sunlight to plants below as it spreads from limb to limb. The weight of the ivy can snap a tree in a storm. Left unmanaged, English Ivy groundcover forces out and kills native plants. It grows through cracks in brickwork and siding. According to the National Park Service it also acts as a "reservoir" for bacteria that is especially harmful to oaks, maples and elms. The NPS suggests that the vines on trees be cut a few feet from the ground to kill the upper portions. The lower portions can be pulled out or killed with herbicide. Groundcover can be easily pulled when the soil is damp and the vines should be disposed of in the garbage. For more information:

Community Affairs

The National Park Service has agreed to meet to discuss establishing an access point between Lakeshead Drive and the Parkway. The other topic to be discussed is the upcoming expansion of I-64 in terms of the impact to the two roadways mentioned and the shared frontage space between QL and the NPS.

In response to an invitation from VDOT to give public comment regarding the I-64 expansion. A letter was submitted highlighting community concerns over storm water management, noise reduction, Lakeshead Drive access during construction and its condition overall. Several members of the committee and community joined in responding to VDOT.

The first scheduled planning meeting for the community is anticipated to be held in March of 2017, for the I-64 phase 3 expansion. Community Affairs hopes to schedule an open meeting in the end of August or early September (details to be communicated once determined) at our clubhouse to ensure we understand the full range of concerns and can address them with VDOT in a coordinated manner.

Residents on the West side and near the dam are reminded that it may be beneficial to take pictures of door frame corners and other areas of their homes that would show cracks before pile driving and road paving occurs during the sewer project.

Paddle Board Lessons on the Lake



Lake Management On June 8th Clarke remapped Queens Lake and the good news is that little to no Curlyleaf pondweed was found. We did discover coons tail a native plant species beginning to re-establishing and also chara algae which looks like a plant. Both provide cover for small fish and are a food source for both fish and ducks and will help filter the lake. In October Clarke will remap the lake to determine any new growth of pondweed that may have sprouted from dormant turions in the lake bed. After the new plant population is determined a treatment plan for 2017 will be formulated. Even though the lake is a bit green the most current water tests are within the normal ranges for nutrients, ph., and dissolved oxygen.














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
