- A. The Website Committee met on Monday, the 27th of July. <u>The following items were discussed.</u>
 - 1. The budget for 2019. While the costs for the newsletter should remain the same, it is hard, at the moment to arrive at a firm number for website. We have made a request of Cox Business for an estimate of the cost of bundling telephone and internet but Cox has not gotten back to us yet. Hopefully we have enough time between now and the 31st of August to nudge them into giving us the figures so that we can make a decision.
 - 2. There was a lengthy discussion of various aspects of the website.
 - a. Expanding the website storefront to include payments in addition to dues. It was decided that this would be at the behest of the individual directors and their committees who could make a request of the Website Committee that the website be adapted to collect their fees.
 - b. Updating website pages will be the responsibility of a webmaster and his/her assistants. Directors will forward requests and data to the website committee for updating their pages when necessary.
 - c. The webmaster and assistants will create a master calendar and will keep it current.
 - d. The webmaster and assistants will also be in charge of the events pages and uploading photos to the galleries.
 - e. The webmaster and assistants will keep the clubhouse reservations calendar current. An interactive calendar was discussed and attempts to develop one are under way.
 - 3. Committee members were asked to look over the "Communications" segment of the handbook in preparation of making changes / edits to it at the next committee meeting.
 - 4. The next committee meeting was scheduled for Monday, September 24, at 7:00 pm at the home of Leah Duckworth
- B. The Communications Committee Budget was completed and transmitted to Gordon Angles. Bundling the phones and the internet with Cox Business is estimated to be more cost-effective than keeping the phones with Verizon and subscribing to internet with Widomaker.





LAKE Six companies were contacted seeking bids for lake services. Reasons varied from, "Not in you service area" to "We don't do lake treatments" and only one new company submitted a proposal. Timmons Group bid was higher than we have been getting from Clarke and their largest body of water they service is only 5 acres. Timmons does offer services that we may need in the future and the plan is to keep in contact with them. There will be no whole lake treatment this year and the plan is to continue to monitor and map the lake and do spot treatments as necessary. The total cost would not exceed \$15,000.

DAM The banks around the spillway have been cleared of brush and trees in accordance to specifications for the dam certification. Materials have been purchased to repair the cracks in the spillway and as soon as Mother nature cooperates with some dry weather the work will be done.

DOCK REPAIR The member with the old dock will be rebuilt soon.

SIGNS The "No Parking" signs for the corners of the dam have been ordered and will be installed this month.

OPEN ITEMS The date for the boat sale is still undetermined.

MARINA

- 1. Contract was finalized with Waters Edge Construction to demolish the boathouse walls and roof including roof support system. Work is tentatively scheduled to start on 10/22/18 and will take 2-3 weeks to complete. Still up in the air is how the construction debris will be hauled away...open bin dumpsters or semi-trucks with dump trailers. Semi-truck is the preferred method but it comes down to availability. Electrician Ray Lawson will handle the electrical side of this project and SPATCO will most likely handle temporarily removing the gas pump and reinstalling it upon job completion. A request SPATCO made was that we remove the bottom section of metal sheathing that runs the width of the boathouse behind the gas pump. In doing that, SPATCO will be able to remove the gas line without ever setting foot inside the boathouse. Danny Winall granted us permission to do so by email confirmation.
- 2. Marina Committee met on August 27th and set fuel price to automatically change at each tank delivery to be price/gallon + 20%.
- A few volunteers gathered at the marina on September 8th
 and emptied the boathouse of valuables ahead of
 demolition. Items were relocated to the sheds and
 included ladders, extensions cords, electrical outlets, fire
 extinguishers and life ring buoys.
- 4. Florence preparation:
- Ramp will remain open from now until "Florence" passes.
- Valves to the gas tank will be closed in order to prevent any spillage should the gas line become damaged.
- The dockmaster and members of the marina committee will routinely do checks on the facility and without risking life or limb, do what needs to be done to keep boats afloat
- The marina patrons that have boats on trailers have been granted permission to park their trailers in the field until the storm passes, the tides return to near normal and the field has been given a chance to dry out a bit.




