LAKE The committee decided not to treat the lake this year since Clarke was late in presenting a treatment proposal and the curleyleaf present in the lake is dying out and no plants have crested the surface. Treating the lake at this point would be pointless and a waste of money. The committee intends to use budgeted lake funds to replace the docks at the West Queens and Holcomb boat accesses and be under budget by about \$7500.

We have a proposal to replace the docks for \$4550 and \$4350 individually or \$7500 if the docks are done at the same time provided we haul away the debris. The new docks would be larger with a bench seat so more Members could enjoy the lake views.

DAM Bruce Keener is preparing the annual dam certification paperwork and I will be meeting with Mr. Phan to review the plans for proper trimming of vegetation on the dam to meet the certification. We are still waiting for a dry spell to apply epoxy to the cracks in the spillway floor.

COMMITTEE MEETING At our April 29 meeting we had a long discussion about the current condition of the QL Dam and recommend that QL begin to set aside funds for a long-range project to stabilize the dam banks. A project of this scope may cost in excess of \$80,000 and we need to be pro-

active and make plan before we are forced to.

The committee will begin revising the lake section of the handbook at our next meeting with plans to have a final draft by August. Non-resident fishing passes were also discussed with several committee members not in favor of the program. The program has been in place for 3 years now and generates about \$1800 per vear. I would like to have a discuss with the board to get their views.

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

The subcommittee appointed to review our investment policy has met and will report their recommendations during the June Finance committee meeting,

The following adjustments to the budget have been made year to date: Refurbish and painting of signs (\$1690). Placement of rock to control erosion along driveway to clubhouse and repairs to gravel walkway and wood border along the patio (\$3040). Repair and maintenance for Marina – these funds will be used for replacement of fuel dispenser and repair of water leak (\$8000). Repair and maintenance – To repair leak in the skimmer line in family pool (\$7200).

The finances of the association remain in good shape with the reserve accounts being adequately funded at this time



#### 2019 Work Day

#### Removal of the failed A-Dock decking

Demolition of the A-Dock walkway has ended. The removal of failed conduit and wiring remains. The Marina Committee will make recommendations and budget projections during the 2019 budget cycle for improvements to the area.

#### Reinstallation of electrical to A-Dock

Power has been reinstalled to the panel box at A-Dock (this panel feeds the double shed, marina office, sanitary pump out and fuel dispenser). The service has not been run to the sanitary pump out and dispenser as we do not have a contract for installation of the fuel dispenser yet.

#### Reinstallation of the Gas Fuel Service:

Six (6) contractors were contacted for pricing the reinstallation fuel service disconnected when the boat house was taken down. Two (2) bids have been received. Option #1 (\$14-20K) is installing the old dispenser; Option #2 (\$7-8K) is to provide a new dispenser.
