Happy Spring, Neighbors,

The Community Affairs Committee has been busy at work trying to serve you. Below are some highlights of the last couple of months.

The Community Affairs Committee is delighted to be able to pass along this update to all Queens Lakers along with our neighbors in Royal Grant, Creekside Landing and Cobble Creek who have read the good news about the pending acquisition of the 245-acre site upon which the Battle of Williamsburg took place in 1862 during the Peninsula Campaign. Drew Gruber, President of the Williamsburg Battlefield Association wrote a note explaining what remains to be done. Below is a summary.

An unprecedented combination of state and federal grants enabled the American Battlefield Trust to raise the funding necessary to acquire the 245-acre Egger Tract, the largest remaining undeveloped portion of the Williamsburg battlefield. That said, there is still more to be done. Below you will find a link to the website where you will find more information about the historical importance of the tract and also information on how you can contribute to ensure the success of the project. In the future, when the Williamsburg Battlefield Association, as stewards of the property, applies for grants to create trails, install signage, etc., the grantor organizations will consider the level of local interest exhibited in the project when awarding funds. The number of unique donors participating in this opportunity to save Egger Tract will be a measure of vested community interest to which the Williamsburg Battlefield Association can refer. I can't think of any group of people who have a more vested interest in the outcome than do we here in Queens Lake, Royal Grant, Creekside Landing and Cobble Creek. That interest will be gaged by the number of unique donors contributing to the cause. The link below will take to the website where you will find more information and advice on how to donate.

Updates:

- There was a wonderful turnout on February 20 to overview the dam remediation project. Thank you everyone who attended. Also, a huge thank you Richard McCluney for putting together an award winning PowerPoint. If you missed it, it is available on the association website.
- The engineering firm, Schnabel was hired and has completed geotechnical studies on the spillway in early March.
- We are in the process of having a special vote to secure the \$36,000 for the wetlands purchase.
- The Lake Sub Committee met with York Country Administrator and Walt Zaremba on March 4. We toured the dam and spillway and explained the repairs needed. The discussion went well. The country asked to review the AMT plans and DCR recommendations to determine how they can assist the Association with some funding.

Thank you to Sue and Richard McClunney for taking on the herculean task of cleaning leaves and dirt from the Will Scarlett/ Princess Pond access steps.

Thank you to Chris Hagar and Craig Marcuson for removing the sandbags placed on the spillway for the engineering study.

Thank you Bruce Keener, for continuing to oversee the dam remediation. Your time and expertise are greatly appreciated.





Queens Lake is in Bloom! Our daffodils, dogwoods and azaleas draw admirers from far and wide. Beautification Committee volunteers continue to keep the sign beds and common areas in Queens Lake tidy and inviting. These committed and energetic neighbors quietly plant the bulbs and trees, weed the landscaped beds and prune the trees and shrubs. Their efforts directly benefit the aesthetics and reputation of Queens Lake and, hence, improve property values in the neighborhood.

- Saturday, March 19 volunteers held a clean-up day. Armed with shovels, rakes, gloves and pruning tools, neighbors spruced-up the common areas for spring.
- Our members' dues pay Townscapes to mow, weed whack, blow debris, mulch, and do the Spring and Fall cleanup of all our common areas. They generally lay mulch the end of May. Townscapes has done commendable, reliable work for our community since taking over from Easton Outdoors.
- Volunteers added additional needed rocks to the erosion control area at the Lakehead sign.
- A new sub committee was formed at our last Beautification meeting. We call it Queens Lake in Bloom and it carries a bright and exciting agenda.
- Volunteers will procure bids for heavy pruning of the large trees adjacent to the parking lot and in front of the clubhouse. All these trees are in danger of losing large branches and possibly causing damage to structures vehicles or people. This was included in the budget.
- The bed adjacent to the clubhouse driveway needs a "refresh" that requires removal of some old shrubs and invasive ground cover plus a reduction in size of the Crepe Myrtles that will soon take over the bed if not contained. In order to stay within budget, we will need volunteer help.
- Flower pots by the clubhouse need annuals.
- Robin Land requested Beautification Committee permission to make a new zinnia bed in the field near the baseball back stop. She will prep the bed with compost and plant seeds in May. You will remember Robin's hard work in producing a beautiful zinnia bed by the pool last year. Thank You, Robin for such a worthy contribution.
- David Dafashy suggested Beautification include a plant sale or exchange to complement the clubhouse yard sale planned for April or May. The sale has been tentatively moved to a later date which may be too late for a plant exchange.

- a. Pool Manager position:
 - 1. Job description Completed.
 - 2. Need to email to the community, with a note about the search, as a first step for candidate search. Also, will place an 'ad' in the Newsletter
 - 3. Similarly, we will kickoff a search for another Swim Lesson coordinator.
- b. New Adult Pump Status
- c. Large Capital Projects for 2022
 - 1. Adult pool resurfacing: Douglas Pools quote is egregious; additional quote in queue. Suppliers are at 16month lead time (meaning best case Fall 2023 actual completion)
 - 2. Family Pool Coping & Tile repair Douglas Pools quote is egregious, additional quote for minimal repairing in queue.
 - 3. New decking (changing concrete) for overhang area Not started
- d. Bubbler/Fountain Repair Not Started
- e. We had many Repair and Maintenance items to be addressed at the end of 2021 season, which would have been easily covered by 2021 Profits, but were not completed within the 2021 Financial/Calendar year. (Auto Chlorine Controller for Family pool, Adult Pump plumbing and Elec, Line reel repair, x30 Brass deck inserts & Handrail/Ladder insert replacement....). Approx ~\$7K of pool retained earnings is proposed to be spent in 2022 to start to bring the facilities up to standard (and finish repairing high priority maintenance items).
- f. Full Details of Planned Expenditures for Major Repairs for 2022 are below. There are two items here particularly interesting, where we take the opportunity of new technology to improve the pool, not only to do the mandatory minimum:
 - 1. We can improve the pool pump system in 5 ways by moving to a Variable Frequency Drive electrical system (vs on/off):
 - a. 'Single Phasing' pump failures can be avoided (major issue in our area)
 - b. The flow of the pump can be tuned according to our needs and particular plumbing arrangement;
 - c. Soft Start/Stop extends the life of our attached plumbing;
 - d. Highly reduced energy consumption (rough estimate ~\$300/month)
 - e. Extended pump life (3 replacements in the past 4 years !!)
 - 2. An automated chlorine controller for the Family Pool is proposed to automate, simplify, and monitor our difficult-to-manage process parameter. One example: we lost 3 prime pool days in 2021 due to human and machine error. One of those times resulted in a ~\$500 waste of chlorine.
- g. Christmas Trees Order from only possible supplier could be as early as March 15. Supply in 2022 looks tight already.
 - Backup Discussed would require a MOQ order of \$15000 ~400 trees; A necessary precondition before order is that we can split the order with another neighborhood or school. So far, this option has not been pursued heavily.
- h. We are moving away from the Landline Telephone / going to a free VOIP service using the WiFi.
- i. Tree Damage Repairs We are now ready to go ahead with selected & quoted repairs.

PRACTICE GROUP DESCRIPTIONS

<u>HATCHLINGS</u>: Ages 4 - 8; Swimmers learn how to safely be in the water, general comfort with floating on their back and beginning to kick.

FLEDGLINGS: Ages 4 - 8; Entry Level-Swimmers able to swim one length of the pool with a kickboard. The coaches will determine readiness for swim meets. Advanced Level-Swimmers able to comfortably swim one length of the pool on their front (25 meters) and kick the entire length of the pool comfortably on their back with a board.

EAGLETS: Ages 9 - 12; Swimmers able to comfortably swim one length of the pool on their front and back. It is expected swimmers will have the strength, endurance, and maturity to swim repeated lengths for an entire practice session.

<u>EAGLES</u>: Ages 13 - 18; Swimmers able to comfortably swim two lengths of the pool on their front and back without stopping; have rudimentary knowledge of two strokes; possess the strength, endurance and maturity to swim repeated lengths for an hour and 10 minute practice session.
