Board Briefs

March 8, 2022

Motion to approve the February 8, 2022 Board Meeting

Minutes: David Dafashy made a motion to approve the minutes and John Walters seconded. Motion passed.

Motion to approve the February 20, 2022 Special Meeting

Minutes: Melanie Houle made a motion to approve the minutes and Patty Bartneck seconded. Motion passed.

Motion : John Walters made a motion to authorize up to \$3,500 to contract with Harper Pools for the VFD Drive and Electrical Hookup of Adult Pool. Rebecca Cho seconded. Motion passed.

Motion : John Walters made a motion to contract with Harper Pools for \$3,845 to install and train for the Automated Chlorine Controller. Rebecca Cho seconded. Motion passed.

Motion : John Walters made a motion to contract with Rosenbaum Fence for \$5,656 to repair the fencing from the tree damage in 2021. Insurance settlement covers this expense. Rebecca Cho seconded. Motion passed.

Motion : David Dafashy made a motion to postpone the March 30th Special Member meeting to vote on the \$36,000 to purchase Wetlands Credits; deferring further discussions to the April 12 Board meeting to hear back from York County officials before a date is setting a date. Ted Lynch seconded. Motion passed.

April 12, 2022

Minutes: Approve March 8, 2022 Board Meeting Minutes. John Walters made a motion to approve the March 8, 2022 Board minutes and Jim McCormack seconded. All approved.

(April 12 - Continued)

Motion : Kate Helwig made a motion to reprice slip B-27 with C-27 for all vessel over 30' and charge 1 and ½ times the current fee; QL member price changes from \$725 per slip to \$1,088 and Limited Member from \$1,275 to \$1,913. Note: slip price remains the same if rented separately by the committee. Rebecca Cho seconded. Motion passed.

Motion : Kate Helwig made a motion to revise the Marina Rules (see attached) to remove the section dealing with kayak storage and add language noting that in keeping the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) Agreement of 2021, Marina Members can show their current dash pass to access the restroom and shower facilities available at the pool bathhouse during operating hours. John McCormack seconded. Motion passed.

Motion : Rebecca Cho made a motion to appoint a 2022 By-laws Review committee to consist of Bob Gaschen, Kate Helwig, Renny Parziale, Bob Evans, T.J. McGuire, Lana Olson to review the QLCA Bylaws for 2022. Chair to be chosen by the committee. Volunteers will have Bylaws update completed by August 30, 2022 or before. David Dafashy seconded. Motion passed.

Motion : Rebecca Cho made a motion to approve seeking legal counsel to advise the board on matters pertaining to the membership and the dam and spillway repairs to include liability involved. Jim McCormack seconded. Motion passed.

Motion : Doug Ellis made a motion to accept the recommendations of the Special Dam Committee to pursue a collaborative partnership for both financial and technical support with York County and to negotiate a Memorandum of Understanding with terms favorable to Queens Lake Community Association. Any agreements are subject to Queens Lake Bylaws, legal counsel review, and shareholder approval. These actions shall not preclude engaging in discussions with other entities. Kate Helwig seconded. Motion passed.

A Few Stray Thoughts from Community Affairs

Was it really just two years ago when all of Queens Lake was scurrying about trying to spruce up the neighborhood in order to put our best foot forward as we prepared to host Virginia Garden Week? Covid put paid to that event as the community, the state, and the nation sank into isolation. Spring has come and gone several times in the interim but that spark that had us out in our yards digging, weeding, pruning seems to have been pretty much extinguished in some of us. But fear not! The Community Affairs Committee has decided to try to rekindle that spark by talking about trees. Our level of concern as regards trees was originally raised by an inquiry about our trees and our own little power grid. One tree trimmer told someone that, in the trade, Queens Lake is called “the land of the giants.” Certainly, the arrival of hurricane season increases our “falling tree anxiety”. However, it’s not just hurricanes that trigger our tree angst. Summer thunder storms and winter ice storms have also used our tall trees to create havoc. Community Affairs is considering trying to put together with local tree trimmers and/or arborists a package deal for those Queens Lakers who would be willing to take advantage of such a package if it were offered during the times of the year when business is slow for the trimmers.

The Community Affairs Committee asks that each of us spend time in our yards looking around with a critical eye in an effort to spot areas where we can quickly improve the “curb appeal” by picking up sticks and branches deposited by recent storms, trimming the grass growing up the post of a mail box, and, while we’re on the subject of mailboxes, checking to see if the post needs straightening or the box itself needs painting. Other suggestions might include trimming the grass and small saplings growing between the drainage culvert and the street and trimming back overgrown bushes especially where driveways enter the street. And, as we begin hurricane season, it is a good idea to take a look at the trees that surround the house and spot any that should be taken down before Mother Nature does the job herself.

One last suggestion is for those hard workers who are diligently cleaning out the overgrown brush in their yards and piling the debris at the curb for pick-up by the county, please call the county (757-890-3780 or go on line to waste@yorkcounty.gov) in a timely manner to schedule the pick-up so that the brush piles don’t sit there for weeks at a time attracting rodents and creating an eyesore.

We all know deep down inside that we can be part of the solution or part of the problem. Let us all resolve to look carefully around our property attempting to see it through the eyes of our neighbors and then to remediate those areas that may be an eyesore or may diminish not just our own property values but also the overall beauty of Queens Lake.

In late March this committee had a great turnout of our membership for trimming shrubs, weed removal, pruning at the clubhouse and surrounding areas. Our committee was able to provide Clubhouse Committee with a neighbor who tilled an area behind baseball field so that Robin Land, of Clubhouse Committee, can continue to plant more zinnia seeds to beautify various areas.

Most especially, many thanks to Laura and Ed Nanartowich for their most tremendous, generous, acts regarding Queens Lake. We should be considered fortunate for their years of dedication in enhancing and improving this area. Many thanks.

General Recreation

Committee discussed options for offering tennis lessons to include nearby neighborhoods – Cobble Creek, Royal Grant and Creekside Landing, but decided to wait until we could solicit interest via a participation survey to be distributed at the May 7 social, as well as online.

The Committee hosted a free “Field and Court Day” on May 7 to promote interest, and provided refreshments and food, as well as tennis, pickleball, badminton and cornhole. Attendance was limited due to inclement weather. The Committee also hosted a “Community Garage Sale” fundraiser, May 7th. Twenty households signed up and attendance was satisfactory despite the rain. Proceeds will support purchase of recreational equipment.

Over forty donations from local businesses contributed items for the upcoming Member Social Silent Auction, June 4th to support recreation.

Volunteer signup for Playground cleanup will take place in June.

Estimates for upper court refinishing (\$26,000), fence (\$22,000) and replacing lights (\$12,000) were received. The Committee also received a quote and samples for a modular grid (Versacourt) as an alternative for the upper (#4) court, potentially modified for pickleball.

There is some interest in pursuing memorial donations (“in memory of”) as part of a capital fundraising campaign for amenities (benches, etc.), and to bring at least one court up to standard.

The understanding of the committee chair is that the Memorandum of Understanding with York County does not bind us to any final agreement with the country, but it is a step in building a relationship with the country to assist the community with funding to fix the dam and spillway, and address the other major issue facing our community, the comprehensive stormwater damage.

Here is a brief overview of the 4 strategic objectives currently in play that fall under the lake committee:

- Repair and Maintain Queens Lake Earthen Dam
- Repair and/or replace the spillway
- Repair and maintain Princess Pond, and the supporting structure (dam). This includes the silting causes by erosion.
- Restore and maintain Queens Lake (and Princess Pond) to their shorelines and depths. This includes upper lake silting.

The blue algae or cyanobacteria scum recently spotted on Princess Pond and the lake does not seem to be spreading. All members need to be aware that this toxic.

Two aerators are not working on Princess Pond, the company who installed them has been contacted.

Several volunteers have offered to build kayak racks on the lake. Thank you.

Special Committee Report and Recommendation for Dam Improvements From April 9, 2022

The Special Committee met with York County on March 4 and April 5, 2022, to discuss dam and drainage remediation issues in Queens Lake.

Attendees included the County Administrator, Neil Morgan; Director of Public Works, Brian Woodward; Director of Stormwater Management, Joe Brogan; Deputy Public Works Director, Rob Krieger; Civil Engineer, Travis Rhodes; and QLCA Special Committee members Jack Dooley (chair), Doug Ellis (QL Board), Mark Frankel (Lake).

As a result of ongoing discussions between our committee and the County, and Supervisor Walt Zaremba, the County Administrator has agreed to partner with the QLCA to provide substantial financial and technical assistance for the dam and spillway repair/replacement as an extension of the planned drainage remediation beginning in the FY23 (July 1, 2022). Per our discussions, the County will increase funding and the scope of work planned for Queens Lake erosion control to include a substantial share of the expense of dam and/or spillway remediation. The County will likely cover expenses related to the spillway (and QLCA, the dam) as they can justify taking care of the stream flow from the upper lake through to the spillway.

Recommendation

1. Enter into a partnership with the County for both financial and technical support.
 - a. Permit County engineering staff to review consultant's assessment of the dam to confirm condition and safety concerns
 - b. Obtain an extension from DCR based on our partnering with the County and addition of spillway work
 - c. The County is prepared to draft a Memorandum of Understanding/Agreement (MOU/MOA) which should be reviewed by QLCA legal counsel, and designate desired outcomes, timetable, respective responsibilities and cost-sharing parameters
 - d. QLCA should grant/sell an easement to the County for design and construction access to cover the proposed project areas, i.e., dam, spillway, etc. (QLCA will retain ownership)
 - e. The County can assume responsibility for design approvals, permitting and environmental impacts and best practices
2. Take a comprehensive approach to the project beyond the immediate improvements for the dam, to include the spillway, lake/pond drainage, dam road/bridge.
 - a. Integrate the dam, spillway, drainage remediation into a single project scope
 - b. Identify areas of neighborhood water erosion for County drainage remediation
 - c. Invite VDOT to the project management team to share dam/spillway design improvements for consideration of road widening and bridge weight-limit increase
 - d. Limit the related road closures and interruptions to a single project
3. Develop a Communications Plan.
 - a. Designate QLCA person(s) to sit on a project management team with stakeholders (i.e. County Public Works/Stormwater Management staff, Consultants and contractors), to provide (monthly) progress and expense reports to the Board and serve as a point-of-contact for Committee and the Board.
 - b. Develop a formal communications process to disseminate information to the Community (i.e. construction schedule, road closings, inspections, etc.)
4. Leverage financial opportunities to preserve capital reserves and limit Member dues increases.
 - a. Designate a QLCA representative to pursue potential grant applications for grants (i.e. DCR Dam Safety and Floodplain Management grants)
 - b. Compile all dam, spillway and related expenses since 2020 for submission to the County in consideration for our "match"
 - c. Provide revised cost projections to the Finance Committee to update the Capital Reserve Study and budgets

These recommendations acknowledge not only the contributions of the volunteers on the Lake Committee and the ongoing consultant's work, but recent collaborative input of County engineering staff, DCR staff. The expectation is a more cost-efficient, comprehensive and sustainable long-range solution to preserve and protect the Lake and our property values for the benefit of the entire Queens Lake Community. Partnering with the County will relieve QLCA of a tremendous financial burden which will allow us to fund other much needed improvements within the association.

HATCHLINGS: Ages 4 - 8; Swimmers learn how to safely be in the water, general comfort with floating on their back and beginning to kick.
