#### **Board Briefs**

#### March 8, 2022

Motion to approve the April 12, 2022 Board Meeting Minutes: John Walters made a motion to approve the minutes and Melanie Houle seconded. Motion passed.

#### **Special Committee Report:**

Doug Ellis reported the Special Committee is waiting for York County to draft a Memorandum of Understanding/ MOU and that a Memorandum of Agreement/MOA is pending and should be reviewed by QLCA legal counsel. The final MOA should designate desired outcomes, timetable, respective responsibilities and cost-sharing parameters. Doug said the Special Committee has not had a meeting with the County since last month but is in continuous contact with County staff and is scheduled to meet Thursday with York County Administrator Neil Morgan and staff.

Motion: Doug Ellis made a motion that upon receiving input from York County engineering staff and review of the dam and spillway engineering reports, the Special Committee recommends moving forward with the purchase of the wetland's credits required for permitting the estimated \$36,000 payable to The Nature Conservancy. The Committee further expects to negotiate a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with York County in June to establish a collaborative working relationship. A subsequent Agreement with the County establishing easements,

funding commitments and scope of work will be subject to Board, Legal and Shareholder approval. This Agreement will amend the County's Capital Improvement Plan (\$1.2M) to include a more comprehensive storm-water management remediation plan for Queens Lake, and is expected to minimize a substantial member dues increase. Adrianne McKinney seconded. Motion passed.

**Motion :** John Walters made a motion to approve a change to the Pool Rules to remove former pool operator John Poorman's name and his phone number noted by the crossout. Rebecca Cho seconded. Motion passed.

**Motion:** John Walters made a motion to approve spending up to \$7,500 for replacement of the Bathhouse water lines. Pool Director will obtain multiple quotes as much as is feasible in the current environment of sub-contractor delays. Funds will come from pool reserves. Jim McCormack seconded. Motion passed.

Motion: Melanie Houle made a motion to offer a pool fee discount of \$100 and free tennis court access to any non-member household that deeds their property in the 2022 calendar year. If a non-member household deeds after the 2022 pool season but still in the 2022 calendar year, the \$100 discount on the pool fee and the free access to the tennis courts can be used for the 2023 season. \$100 will be transferred from the administrative budget to the pool budget to cover the discount. Rebecca Cho seconded. Motion passed.

Special thanks to our Committee members that make it happen.

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
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### Membership

A meeting of the lake committee was held at the club house on June 22. The following members attended: Adrianne McKinney, Richard Toth, Mark Phinney, Lana Olson and guest Chris Kolloff.

Major points of discussion included:

- 1. A discussion about committee concerns about what the county will and will not do was a major focus as we wait for the MOU. The main concern that the dam and lake (sediments) be "restored", not just "remediated". Restoration of Princess Pond and Queens Lake depth and surface areas should be an integral part of storm water management and erosion control.
- 2. The repaired spillway should provide a way to control the level of the lake.
- 3. The committee would like to build and maintain an access (boat ramp) to the lake for equipment needed to control storm water, erosion, silting and maintain the depth and surface area of the lake and pond. (suggested location: at the West Queens end of the dam. With limited public access)
- 4. The committee would like improve access to Princess Pond dam and maintain 'non-earthen' infrastructure required for control of storm water, erosion and silting. With possible assistance from the county.
- 5. We should consider lowering of the lake prior to hurricane season.
- 6. Repairs to the aeration pump on Princess Pond. Solitude came out in June, and they have given us a quote. They are very behind in doing repairs, but it should be done by August. The blue algae spotted in the spring appears to be common in our area when the weather is changing from cool to hot. Do not swim or drink the water.
- 7. Creating a presentation to the neighborhood about the scope of storm water drainage issues that need to be addressed to the County and state.
- 8. Obtaining a map showing the depth of the both the lake and the pond to see how much sediment has developed.
- 9. Thank you to John Blommel for hosting the Queens Lake Fishing tournament on Queens Lake Day. The Fish did not disappoint.
- 10. Thank you to the volunteers who have offered to build more canoe and kayak racks. We look forward to these.
- 11. Thank you to T.J. McGuire who is maintaining the Princess Pond access stairs enjoyed by both fisher-people and walkers.

A May 2023 QL in Bloom is being planned so that we might visit more of our members' beautiful gardens.




Lucile Kossodo's garden features native plants as well as this huge lotus foliage.

#### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS VACANCIES for 2023**

Several Directors will be completing their terms on the Board this November. The Board will appoint a Nominating Committee which will be seeking candidates to fill the vacancies. According to our Bylaws, Shareholders may also nominate persons to run for election. These written nominations must be signed by three Shareholders in good standing, include a written statement on the part of the nominee expressing willingness to run for election, and be received in the office by October 4th in order to be included on the ballot.

The nominee must be a QLCA Member in good standing; that is, he or she is a Share-holder or an adult resident of a Queens Lake Property occupied by a Shareholder, and have all required dues and fees paid. Directors are elected for a term of two years, are expected to uphold the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Association, attend evening Board Meetings, and oversee at least one of the Association's Standing Committees.

- 5. SELF PROPELLED USE: All members can enjoy FREE use of the Marina for "self-propelled" watercraft such as canoes, kayaks and stand-up paddle boards(SUPs). Registration is required and yes, you can do it online.
- 6. FINANCIALS: YTD earnings are \$35,998.20. QLCA's financial reports indicate a balance in the Davenport Marina Reserve Account of \$434,460.91 as of June 30, verses \$469,304.13 at the end of January with no withdraws.
- 7. CAMERAS ONSITE: A reminder that there are 3 surveillance cameras in use at the Marina. Cameras are NOT MONI-TORED however recordings are used to assist in managing the facility and can be provided to law enforcement if needed.
- 8. REPAIRS & MAINTENANCE: Committee volunteers continue to manage an ongoing "TO DO LIST" saving the Association thousands of dollars. These savings increase the facilities annual retained earnings which are applied to future maintenance and capital replacement projects. If members did not perform general maintenance tasks, expenses and by extension fees would increase. THANK A COMMITTEE MEMBER TODAY!
- 9. SANITARY PUMP OUT: The system is operational & passed annual inspection by the VA Department of Health.
- 10. FUEL: ValvTect recertified our fuel in June. Sales remain brisk. Current price is \$4.20 per gallon. Contact Dockmaster Chris Kolloff at 757-642-7019 for service; 24-hour notice is appreciated.

In November 2018, I was elected to the QLCA Board and appointed as Marina Director. At this time the boathouse over A-Dock was being removed due to safety concerns. The demolition revealed additional failures to the deck/pilings under and behind the structure. Committee members removed the failed decking and a contractor removed the pilings. The Committee chose to leave several pilings and a large section of dock near the spillway ("the picnic deck") in hopes that it could be repurposed. In order to safely remove the boathouse, the power, fuel dispenser and sanitary pump were also disconnected. I knew about the boathouse demolition when I agreed to serve. I did not know that so many essential services would also need to be replaced. I am thrilled to report that all major services including the entrance gate, fuel pump, water service, cameras, marine sanitary pump out and electrical are now fully operational. The Marina Committee is now moving forward with "post boathouse" duties. At the 2020 Annual Meeting, members approved \$20,500 from Marina Reserves to hire a consultant to prepare a "master plan" for the marina. An RFP was sent to seven (7) firms. On July 12, three (3) contactors attended a pre-bid meeting to discuss our needs. As of this date, we have received two (2) bids. The Marina Committee will review proposals at their regularly scheduled meeting on Monday, July 25. I will then present a motion at the August Board Meeting to approve the Committee's recommendations. My objective is to have plan ready to present to full membership on or before the November Annual Meeting. Please join me in thanking the many Marina Committee members, both past and present, for getting us to this point. My term as Director will end at this year's Annual Meeting. My goal has always been to see that the Marina is a safe and welcoming facility for all QLCA members. I hope that trend continues and that you make time to visit and enjoy this unique and special part of our community.
