Queens Lake is called home to a variety of homeowners - commuters, active duty personnel, college professors, retirees and many others. Some residents were assigned here, many have resided here for twenty years or more, still others have grown up here, moved away for school or career, and returned to raise their own families. Reasons include location, amenities and facilities, or reputation.

A lot has changed since the neighborhood was chartered over seventy years ago. The original residents ranked a pool and clubhouse as top amenities, but also a horse stable and boathouse were considered. Tennis courts were later added along with a marina. Since those early days, a variety of controversial issues have surfaced, including proposals to develop high-density housing nearby and a golf course adjacent to New Quarter Park (both unsuccessful), construct sound-walls along the I-64 corridor and tap into a county sewer system (both successful). More recent conversations include improving the lake and earthen dam, upgrading the pool and clubhouse, and restoring the racquet courts.

Earlier this year a special Strategic Planning Committee was tasked to solicit input to offer a vision on the future of Queens Lake. Some early suggestions include a community vegetable garden and butterfly garden, dog-walk area, pickleball courts, new canoe/kayak launch, and a digital online payment system. The committee is still seeking input from both members and future (non) members via email, online qlcavision@queenslake.net and in-person, with the results to be compiled and presented at our annual meeting in November. This is your chance to offer some feedback. I hope you will take an opportunity to lend your voice to help shape a vision for our very exceptional community.

2024 BOARD OF DIRECTORS VACANCIES

Several Directors will be completing their terms on the Board this November. The Board will appoint a Nominating Committee which will be seeking candidates to fill the vacancies. According to our Bylaws, Shareholders may also nominate persons to run for election. These written nominations must be signed by three Shareholders in good standing, include a written statement on the part of the nominee expressing willingness to run for election, and be received in the office by October 4th in order to be included on the ballot. The nominee must be a QLCA Member in good standing; that is, he or she is a Shareholder or an adult resident of a Queens Lake Property occupied by a Shareholder, and have all required dues and fees paid. Directors are elected for a term of two years, are expected to uphold the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of the Association, attend evening Board Meetings, and oversee at least one of the Association's Standing Committees. 

Virginia Resources Division conducted a lake wide fish survey in June. We expect to receive the full written report with data points in the month of July. Once received, the fish survey will be posted on the QLCA website so residents can compare to the 2016 fish survey.

A reminder that Queens Lake is posted as a catch and release private recreational lake. However, any caught grass carp or American eel should not be put back into the lake.

- **November 30, 2024:** DCR Alteration permit expires (submitted 04/26/2021)
- April 30, 2025: Second two-year conditional operation & maintenance certificate expires
- **April 30, 2025:** Emergency Preparedness Plan (EPP) expires

The goal of Marina Committee is to bring marina patrons and all Association members, a safe, clean, welcoming marina that can be enjoyed with family and friends!

FINANCIALS: The Marina's cash on hand as of end of June 2023 was \$35k and Capital Reserves of approximately \$468k

SLIP RENTALS: Annual slip renewals were sent out by the Committee in December. As of the end of June, we were at 87% occupancy with 55 of 63 slips rented. The Capital Reserves will help maintain existing docks and ensure the marina is available to enjoy for years to come. Annual slip fees vary according to slip and boat size. Slips can now be paid by cash, check, credit or ACH bank draft. A list of available slips, with rates is posted at the marina gazebo and on the website.

SELF PROPELLED ACCESS: All QLCA members in good standing enjoy FREE use of the Marina for "self propelled" water craft (aka canoes, kayaks and stand-up paddle boards/SUPs). Registration is required. Forms can be found on line at the marina's website. Patrons will be issued a parking pass and boat sticker.

FUEL: Fully operational with ValvTech Marine Fuel. Current price is \$3.99 per gallon but adjusts monthly. Fuel sales are by appointment; 24-hour notice is requested. Contact Dockmaster Chris Kolloff @ 757-642-7019 or cbkolloff@gmail.com.

Happy Summer, QL Friends!

Hope everyone is enjoying the summer months! Although many of you have already heard the good news, I am happy to report that the Colonial Parkway is undergoing a major rehabilitation. The park received \$123 million in funding for repairs and maintenance of the parkway. The project will include rehabilitating the pavement, shoulders, and the Williamsburg Tunnel, repairing 11 bridges and improving drainage and climate resilience. The work is set to begin in August and will continue over a three-year period. The goal is to be finished with the project by June 2026 in time for the 250th commemoration of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Dominion Power seems to be moving forward with the underground project. Moving power lines underground will benefit QL by making outages in area shorter and less frequent. According to the Dominion website, the construction is in "development on Cospe". If you have been notified of the project starting on your street, you can check the status of the project online at DominionEnergy.com/Underground. Please let Community Affairs know if you become aware of any scheduled outages as sometimes these outages will affect other streets.

A friendly reminder, when parking recreational vehicles and personal vehicles to be mindful of service vehicles, i.e., mailman, delivery drivers. Also, school is out so watching your speed is a must! Neighbors have reported incidences of speeding on East and West Queens Drive.

Latisha's House is a non-profit that provides a long-term safe house for adult female victims of human trafficking and provides support to help restore their lives. 
Membership Status


I could not have pulled this off without these 20+ leaders and the countless other volunteers. I thank you all, you each gave of yourselves for the good of the community.




